

CPR Certification – Tuolumne Joint Powers Authority

Education code 35179.1 -States coaches will have certification in CPR and first aid – the only mention of online training is for concussions.

California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) states "please consult your school district for this requirement". The district might have more specific and/or additional requirements. The CIF does allow for a one season exemption in case of emergency.

California Code of Regulations – Title 5 Education – Must have a <u>valid CPR card</u> and is applicable to coach students at any grade level.

The American Heart Association and the American Red Cross- are fine with online instruction as long as the student takes a skill/hands on session with an American Heart Association or American Red Cross instructor within 60 days. *AHA training center or an AHA instructor approved through an AHA training center.

American Emergency Medical Advisory Association – This organization reviews vendor online CPR training and gives them their seal of approval.

AB 245 – (McKinnor) High School Athletics: California High School Coaching Education and Training Program: Emergency Action Plan- This bill revises and recasts the California High School Coaching Education and Training Program's requirements for training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and first aid by July 1, 2024, requiring training in recognizing and responding to the signs and symptoms of cardiac arrest and adds a certification in the use of an AED to the training component of that program.

<u>March 23, 2016</u> – Committee members discuss both hands on and internet training. The consensus was that since the Red Cross and American Heart Association do not recognize internet certification, without hands on training component the JPA would propose that all applicable personnel have the hands on training component every two years. Implementation would include JPA provided trainings twice per year as well as developing a list of providers for Districts to access as needed.

<u>January 11, 2024</u> - Committee members discussed hybrid training, reaching a consensus that districts will have the option of flexibility to incorporate hybrid training, with the condition that the hands-on component must be conducted in-person *American Red Cross or AHA training center or an AHA instructor approved through an AHA training center. The JPA will maintain its commitment to conducting in-person trainings three times a year and will also furnish districts with a roster of instructors.
